Voting Plan Checklist

GET REGISTERED

Confirm you are registered to vote at your current address! Check your registration on your state's website through tools offered by the U.S. Election Assistance Commission (eac.gov) or through the independent, nonpartisan League of Women Voters (vote411.org).

Make sure your friends and family are registered, too. Even regular voters can forget to change their registration after moving or another life change. Ask those you live with, your friends, your family and your co-workers if they are registered to vote.

GET READY

Decide which voting option is best for you. Do you want to vote in-person, before Election Day or by mail? Options vary by state, so check your state's election rules. If you're voting by mail, be sure to request your ballot ASAP.

Identify your polling location. Be sure to look up the location and hours your polling location is open with your local election office.

Plan a time to vote, if you're voting in-person. Decide if you're voting after or before work, how you'll get to the polls, and any other logistical considerations.

Research the candidates on your ballot, especially in state and local races. The League of Women Voters (vote411.org) has a useful guide on candidates on offices that will appear on your ballot.

GO VOTE

Bring a friend or co-worker with you to the polls to double your impact.
